## **Days for Girls**

Days for Girls increases access to menstrual care and education by developing global partnerships, cultivating social enterprises, mobilizing volunteers, and innovating sustainable solutions that shatter stigmas and limitations for women and girls. Days for Girls chapter organizations and enterprises hand sew sustainable and reusable menstrual pads.

The local chapter in Gainesville works to empower women internationally by providing access to sustainable menstrual pads, health education, and setting up enterprises. They are also working with vulnerable women's populations in the local community to provide access to sustainable menstrual pads and sewing skills.

Days for Girls is the official international service project for UF Rotaract and was started during spring 2018.
